

Aud graduated from Tailor Trade School in Bergen and worked at Modell Klaer as a tailor, making and modeling ladies coats before her marriage. She was a Norwegian Youth Medal winning skier.

Aud was married to Gordon J. Severson on February 14, 1954, at Laksevag Lutheran Church in Bergen. Valentine's Day 2024 would have been their 70th wedding anniversary. She came to the U.S. in April 1954, visiting Gordon's parents in Wisconsin en route to Alaska, first in Anchorage and then Nome. To this union were born son Marshall Gordon and daughter Louise Audrey. Aud was naturalized as a U.S. citizen in Fairbanks, Alaska, on Jan. 17, 1958. They lived in Fairbanks 1957-1965, except for two years

in France and Germany in 1962-1963, when Gordon was recalled to active duty from the U.S. Army Reserve. Aud served as President of American Legion Auxiliary Unit 11 in Fairbanks from 1961-1962.

Anchorage has been home since 1965. Aud graduated from Anchorage Beauty College in October 1966 and worked as a hairdresser for 30 years. She was owner and operator of Aud's Styling Salon in the Arctic Business Park from 1984 until retiring in 1996.

Aud is a longtime member of Pioneers of Alaska Women's Igloo 4; American Legion Auxiliary Jack Henry Unit 1; VFW Auxiliary 1685; Sons of Norway Bernt Balchen Lodge; and St. Mark Lutheran Church. She is survived by husband, Gordon; sister, Grethe Storhaug; several nieces, nephews and cousins in Norway; son, Marshall (Margaret) Severson; daughter, Louise (Kim) Eshenower; granddaughter, Alison Eshenower (Aaron Williamson); grandson, Elliot Severson; granddaughter, Daria Severson; great-granddaughters, Aliyah Banta and Audrey Williamson; and great-grandson, Ash Gordon Williamson, all of Alaska. She was predeceased by granddaughter Adrien Eshenower. # In Remembrance

#### John T. Jensen June 17, 1939 - January 3, 2024



John T. Jensen, 84, died on January 3, 2024, due to complications from leukemia. John was born on June 17, 1939, in Hawthorne, Nevada, to Verna and Louis Jensen. On December 18, 1965, he married Charlotte Jensen, at Holy Family Catholic Church in Anchorage, Alaska.

John attended kindergarten in San Diego, California, before moving to Montana with his parents and brother, Duane. They purchased the Holland Lake Lodge in Montana in 1947. A fire burned the picturesque log lodge to the ground the day before guests were scheduled to arrive.

Following the loss of the lodge, John's family lived in John Day, Oregon, before moving to Craig, Nebraska, near his father's family farm. John's mother was hired as the elementary school teacher in Alaska and John's father was hired as the special assistant.

In 1949, John, his brother, parents and pet dog Tugger traveled north to the small Athabaskan village of Tanacross, Alaska. In John's manuscript about his life, he wrote: "In Tanacross the northern lights hung in the sky like beautiful green sheets rippling in the breeze. I remember sound carried so well when it was 60 below. We used to go out and play when it warmed up to 20 below. Living close to the land is still important to many Alaskans and, as we become more urbanized, it appears many of us are looking back to see where we have been."

John's mother, Verna accepted a teaching job at Mt. Edgecumbe High School in Sitka, Alaska where John graduated from Sitka High School in 1958. John attended the University of New Mexico Military Institute, the University of Idaho (B.A.), Colorado State (M.A.) and the University of Colorado (Ed.S.).

In 1963 John moved to Anchorage where he built the family home, met his wife Charlotte and raised two children, Kay and Mike. In 1964, he accepted a job with the Anchorage School District where he worked primarily as an Industrial Arts Teacher for 31 years. He owned a commercial setnet site on the Combine Flats of the Nushagak River, and operated the site with his son Mike from 1987 to 1999. John was an avid sport fisherman and captured the grandeur of our state over the years. John enjoyed reading, travel and painting. In his 70s, he discovered ballroom dancing. John was a "do-it-your-selfer" and a jack-of-all-trades. He could fix just about anything. His son Mike learned many skills while holding a flashlight for his dad over the years.

John was a member of Pioneers of Alaska, Anchorage Igloo #15, Sons of Norway and the Anchorage Federation of Teachers #1175. He was a Fur Rondy Board Member for 10 years and volunteered with the Charlotte Jensen Native Arts Market since 1995. He made many friendships over the years with Alaska Natives who traveled to the event from all over the state.

John is survived by his partner, Kay Gatlin; children, Mike and Kay; and grandchildren, Lauren, Elias and Rainey. John was preceded in death by his parents, Verna and Louis; brother, Duane (1968); and wife, Charlotte (2010.)

John had a rare blood type and donated 18 gallons of blood over his lifetime. John's final wishes: "Give blood - Be a donor." Please donate in his name. He also requested the consideration of monetary donations to the Blood Bank of Alaska, Dollars for Dogs, the Anchorage Public Library and the Nature Conservancy.

#### Gene Axel Moe November 10, 1930 - January 24, 2024

Gene left this world peacefully at age 93. His wife Shirley, of 70 years, was by his side.

He came to Alaska from McGregor, Minnesota, after graduation in 1948. He served in the Korean War with the U.S. Army and represented his country proudly. After his service he returned to Alaska followed shortly by his wife Shirley. Gene was always a focused, hard worker. In 1959, Gene, with his brothers by his side, started his union concrete finishing business M & M Contractors.

Gene was an avid outdoorsman. He loved being outside enjoying the adventures and beauty of Alaska. He had many tales of these adventures. The most notorious of these was his killing of a Kodiak brown bear with a four inch Buck knife.



Church and community were important parts of his life. Gene was a founding member of Baxter Road Bible Church. He was a member of Sons of Norway and a vital part in the construction of Viking Hall.

Gene and Shirley had four children: Karl (Vicki) Moe, Jane Moe Newby, Heidi (Tony) Coop and Eric Moe. He is also survived by his grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
